Submitted abstracts and papers written in English should comply with the format of the Conference Instruction for Authors, must not have been published before and not be under review for any other conference or publication. All abstracts and papers will be subjected to a "blind review" by at least two members of the Scientific Committee.

A Book of Abstracts will be published following the conference.

By providing the chance to submit full research papers for publication, the conference hopes to promote the exposure of the research presented at the site on a global scale. Selected full papers from the Conference will have an opportunity to be published in the following publications:
